- C. Science article mysterious disease starting to kill American beech trees. Some researchers believe a nematode native to Asia is causing the disease.

III. RESIDENT, BUSINESS, UTILITY INQUIRIES/ACTIONS

• K. Burke (HOA – the ENCLAVE) – provided input into removal/remediation of select mature Pin Oaks along Avenue of Two Commons. Tree in middle of row is splitting and needs removed.

• C. Tracey (168 Spruce) – inspected trees in backyard for sign/symptoms of hazards. Recommended pruning.

IV. NEW AND UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. Conference/Seminar Debriefs -

- NJ Shade Tree Federation 94th Annual Conference October 24-25, 2019 in Atlantic City. W. Gerth attended both days, M. Russell and S. Minis attended Oct. 25. First year for separate Municipal and LTE/LTCO tracks.
- Municipal Shade Tree Management at Rutgers November 13, 2019. W. Gerth attended. Shrewsbury should consider obtaining a GIS system that can be shared by DPW, STC, Borough Engineer, Hose Company, and other stakeholders. STC would benefit from a system that would allow integration of tree inventory data. K. Doran-Eulner will follow-up with Borough Engineer to see if this might be of interest. A repository of STC ordinances was obtained that will be useful to consider when reevaluating shade tree ordinances for the Borough.
- Pruning Basics Class conducted by STC members for residents on November 16. Special thanks to Kim (inspiration, communications), Stu (tree owner's manual, equipment) and Jim (course input, hands-on). The class was attended by 8 residents and 1 non-resident. Favorable attendee feedback was received. Conducted light pruning at Boro Hall. STC agreed to make this an annual event. Mr. Slattery suggested we conduct the class in the spring as homeowners will be eager to apply their new skills as the weather improved. STC agreed to conduct the class as a recurring event on the third Saturday of April in place of the monthly meeting.
- **B.** Budgets (2019 and Proposed 2020): estimated 2019 expenditures \$12,776; proposed 2020 budget is \$13,400 representing a 4.6% increase from 2019. Increase due entirely from additional landscape maintenance at the Wardell House.
- C. Community Forestry Management Plan (CFMP) No updates.
- **D.** Community Stewardship Incentive Program (CSIP) Grant: Conducted site inspection with UN UCF Forester (M. Martini) on December 13. No issues. Final inspection will be in December 2020.

E. Borough Tree/Shrub Maintenance:

- Declining mature Sycamore tree along Sycamore Avenue was removed by County STC.
- Mr. Gerth and Ms. Doran-Eulner developed fact sheet of the pros/cons of removal/replacement of legacy Ash trees along Park Avenue for neighboring residents. Went door-to-door on October 27, 2019 to provide information to residents and seek their input. Many residents cherish the islands and the trees. Residents appreciated the outreach.
- Reviewed preliminary landscape plans for Municipal Complex (northeast area of Manson Park, northwest area of Gopher Field). Agreed to obtain stakeholder (e.g., EC, RC, DPW, OS, SCG, SGC, residents) input.

 - D. Skop (65 Borden Street) 'Autumn Blaze' Maple. Installed buck rub protection.
